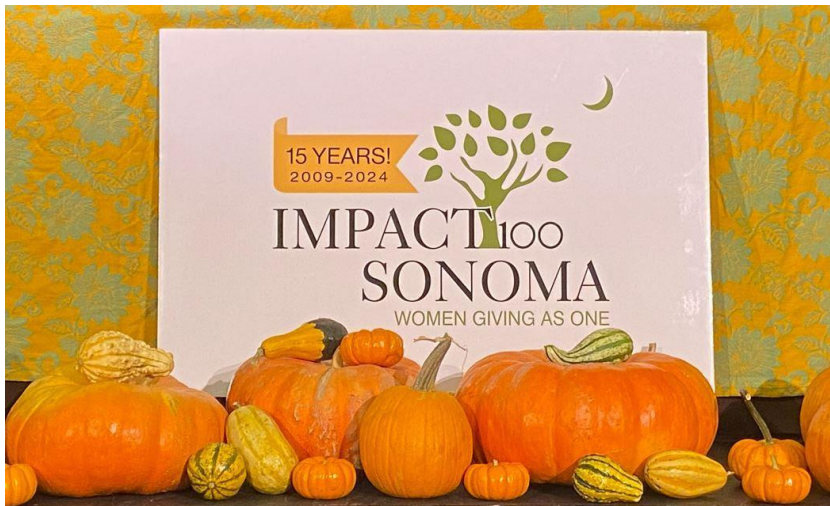


WHAT IS THE FRC?

The **Financial Review Committee** (FRC) acts as the fiduciary for Impact100 Sonoma, evaluating the financial statements and related data provided by nonprofits to ensure that they have the financial viability and stability needed to support their grant applications. **This critical process is distinct from the grant-focused qualitative assessments of the Grant Review Committees (GRCs).**

FRC work is intensely focused over a three-week period in January and involves two committee meetings, during which members review the financials of every vetted grant applicant. If you've served on an FRC before, you'll hear from its leaders shortly. 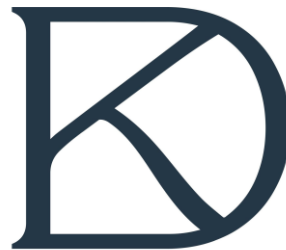

Grant Recipients Update Meeting Informs and Inspires

It was the anecdotes of individuals helped that most moved members, guests, and nonprofit partners who attended the Grant Recipients Update Meeting at the

Sonoma Community Center's Andrews Hall on October 21. A senior receiving rental assistance for the first time in her life. A free heart health screening serving 130 young people and identifying an above-average two in need of further care. High school students visiting a college campus and realizing a new world of possibilities. Unhoused residents moving into tiny homes. A mentee overcoming her fear of kayaking. A young client finding friendship and understanding in equine therapy.

These touching moments brought our record \$337,400 of 2023 funding to vivid life, with 14 full-grant recipients presenting recent results. "Your impactful stories made the event very powerful," wrote **Marcia Carruthers**, Grants Co-Chair. "It is a testament to the dedicated work that you do to make Sonoma Valley a better place."
