On Saturday morning, April 29, we gathered at Hanna Center to honor our 2023 Impetus Grant recipients and salute their ongoing work toward a more just and thriving Sonoma Valley.

“Sweet **16**” grants awarded (record **14** full Impetus Grants + **2** partial grants)
6 first-time full grant recipients, including **5** first-time applicants
\$337,400 grants total—our largest annual amount ever!
\$3,661,900 cumulative grants total since 2010
60 member volunteers working on grant review
